2009 YEAR IN REVIEW

2008: THE YEAR IN REVIEW

The Southwest Florida Region experienced declining economic conditions over the past two years.

LABOR FORCE, EMPLOYMENT AND UNEMPLOYMENT The Southwest Florida labor force decreased by 3,802 persons or 0.5% in 2008. Unemployment in the region increased to 7.5% in 2008 compared to 4.7% in 2007. In 2007, the entire region experienced high rates of unemployment that exceeded the state level.

AIRPORT PASSENGERS The number of regional airline passengers decreased this past year. Southwest Florida International Airport experienced a 5.5% decrease in the number of Airline passengers; Sarasota/Bradenton Airport reported a decrease of 3.5%, while Naples Airport reported a decrease of 82.2%. As in the past years, passenger traffic peaked temporarily in the month of March, with more than 1,238,542 people traveling through Southwest Florida Airports.

BUILDING PERMITS The construction industry, a major sector of the Southwest Florida economy, recorded an annual decrease in the number of building permits issued last year; due to the recent slump in the housing market. The region experienced a 62.4% decrease in the number of single family permits issued and a 73.8% decrease in the number of multi-family permits issued in 2008. Overall, total regional dwelling unit permits decreased by 67.7%. Please note in supporting tables: communities with incomplete information.

The value of all reported residential permits decreased 63.5% from \$2.8 billion in 2007 to \$1.0 billion in 2008. The total value of all reported permit activity decreased 47.5% from \$6.4 billion in 2007 to \$3.4 billion in 2008.

SALES ACTIVITY Regional gross and taxable sales decreased in 2008. Gross sales decreased 11.7%, from \$50.6 billion in 2007 to \$44.6 billion in 2008. Taxable sales totaled \$24.1 billion in 2008; a decrease of 13.5% over 2007 taxable sales of \$27.9 billion. Typically, the winter and spring months of December through May register the highest gross/taxable sales. January and April were the peak months for gross (\$4.9 billion) and taxable (\$2.6 billion) sales respectively.

CONSUMER PRICE INDEX The Consumer Price Index measures the cost of items in several specific categories and is used as an indicator of the general rate of inflation through time. Between 2007 and 2008, the Consumer Price Index for all Urban Consumers, of the CPI-U, rose 3.8% from 207.3 to 215.3.

AIRPORT ACTIVITY

Airport passenger activity for the Southwest Florida Region increased 5.1% in January 2009 from December 2008. Airport passengers visiting and leaving the region totaled 847,194 as compared to 806,250 in the previous month. SW Fla. airport reported an increase in passenger activity & Sarasota/Brad. reported a decrease in passenger activity from the previous month.

In January 2009, total airport activity for the region decreased 6.7% from the previous year. All three airports reported a decrease in passenger activity from the previous year.

UNEMPLOYMENT

The regional unemployment rate for January 2009 was 10.4%, which was higher than the revised rate of 9.2% for December 2008. Lee County at 11.5%, had the highest unemployment rate in the six-county region, with Charlotte County second at 11.0%. Glades County had the lowest unemployment rate at 7.8%. The January 2009 regional unemployment rate of 10.4% was higher than the state at 8.8%. The regional unemployment rate increased by 73.1% from January 2008 to January 2009, while the state rate increased by 87.9% during the same time period.

The Consumer Price Index (CPI-U) for all urban consumers measures the cost of items in several specific categories and is used as an indicator of the general rate of inflation through time. The CPI-U during January 2009 increased 0.4% from December 2008. The CPI-U for January 2009 was 211.1, an increase of 0.0% from January 2008.

SALES ACTIVITY

Sales activity in Southwest Florida is measured by gross and taxable sales for each county. For December 2008, gross and taxable sales in the region totaled approximately \$3.2 million and \$1.9 million, respectively. This is a 2.5% increase in gross sales and a 16.3% increase in taxable sales from November 2008. Glades & Sarasota Counties both reported a decrease in gross sales and Glades County was the only one to report a decrease in taxable sales this month as compared to November 2008.

Gross sales in the region between December 2007 and December 2008 decreased 25.2%. Taxable sales decreased 20.1% during the same period. By incorporating the change in the cost of living (0%) and the average annual population growth rate (4.3%) for the same time period, real gross sales decreased 39.5% per capita. Real taxable sales decreased 30.5%.

BUILDING PERMITS

Residential building activity is measured by the number of single-family and multifamily building permits issued during a given month. In January 2009, 127 residential permits were issued in Southwest Florida. This is 174 less permits than were issued in January 2008. The number of units covered by these permits decreased by 440 from 585 in January 2008 to 145 in January 2009. Compared with the figures reported for December 2008, the number of units for January 2009 decreased by 38. From December 2008 to January 2009, permits issued decreased by 33.

The region reported a residential building valuation of \$38,262,377 in January 2009. This is an decrease of 64.9% compared to the valuation of residential permits issued in January 2008, which totaled \$109,156,911.

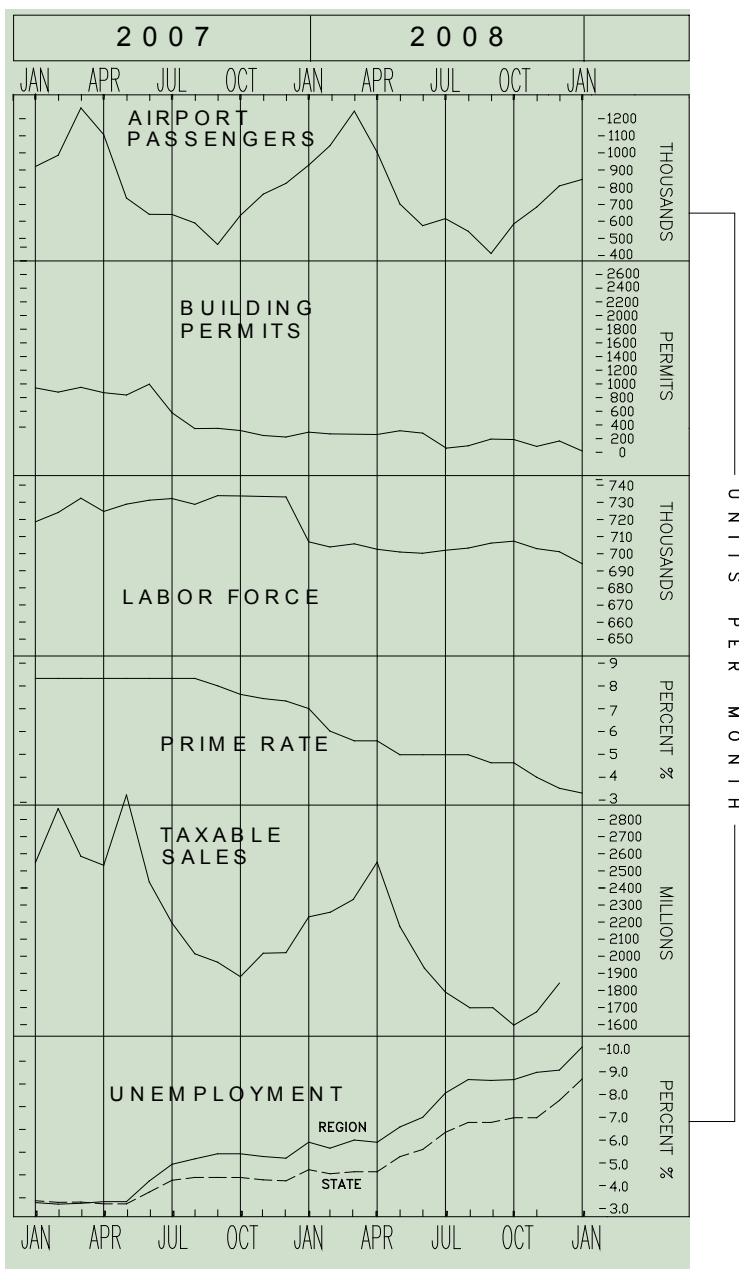
