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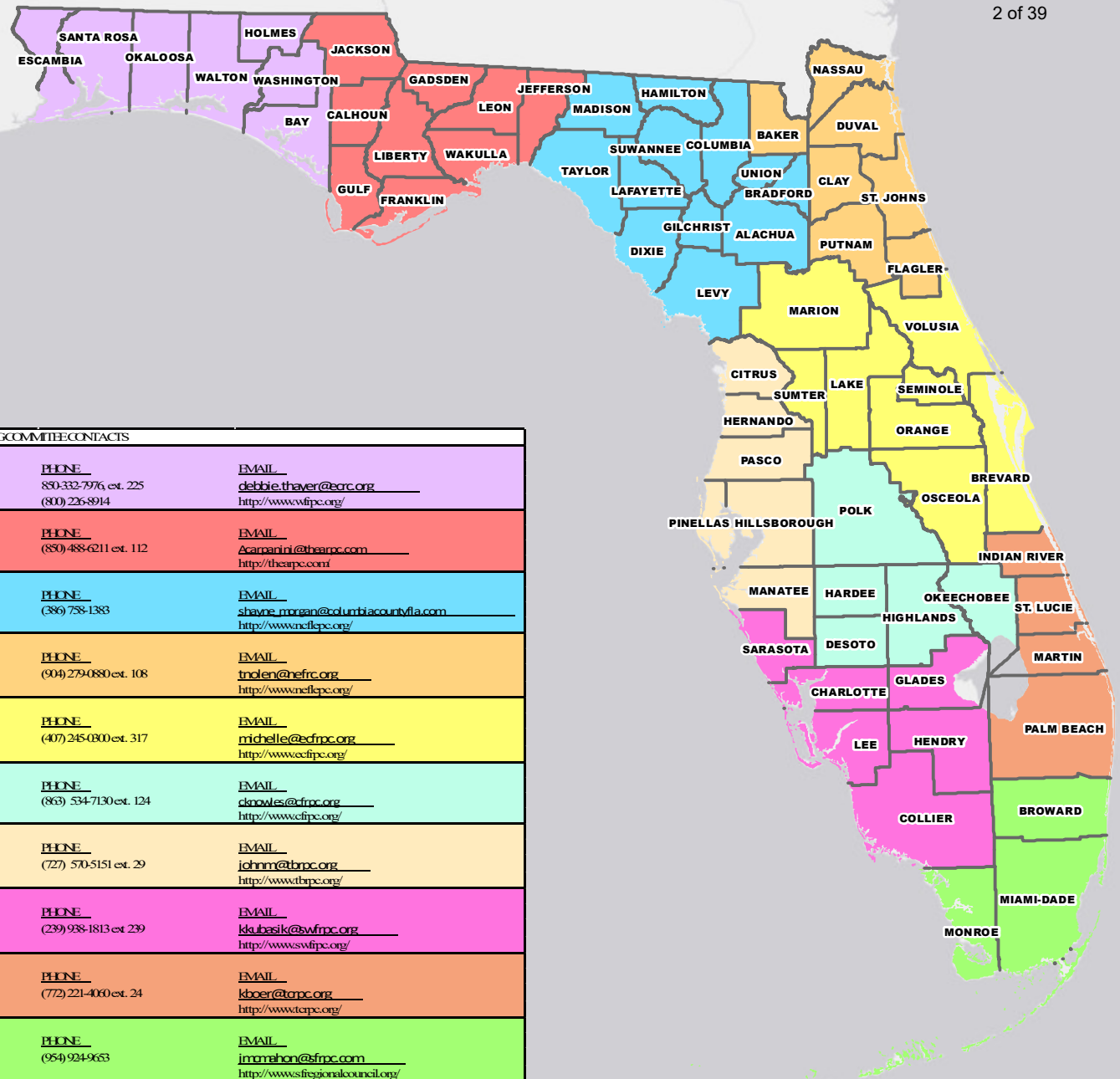

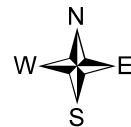

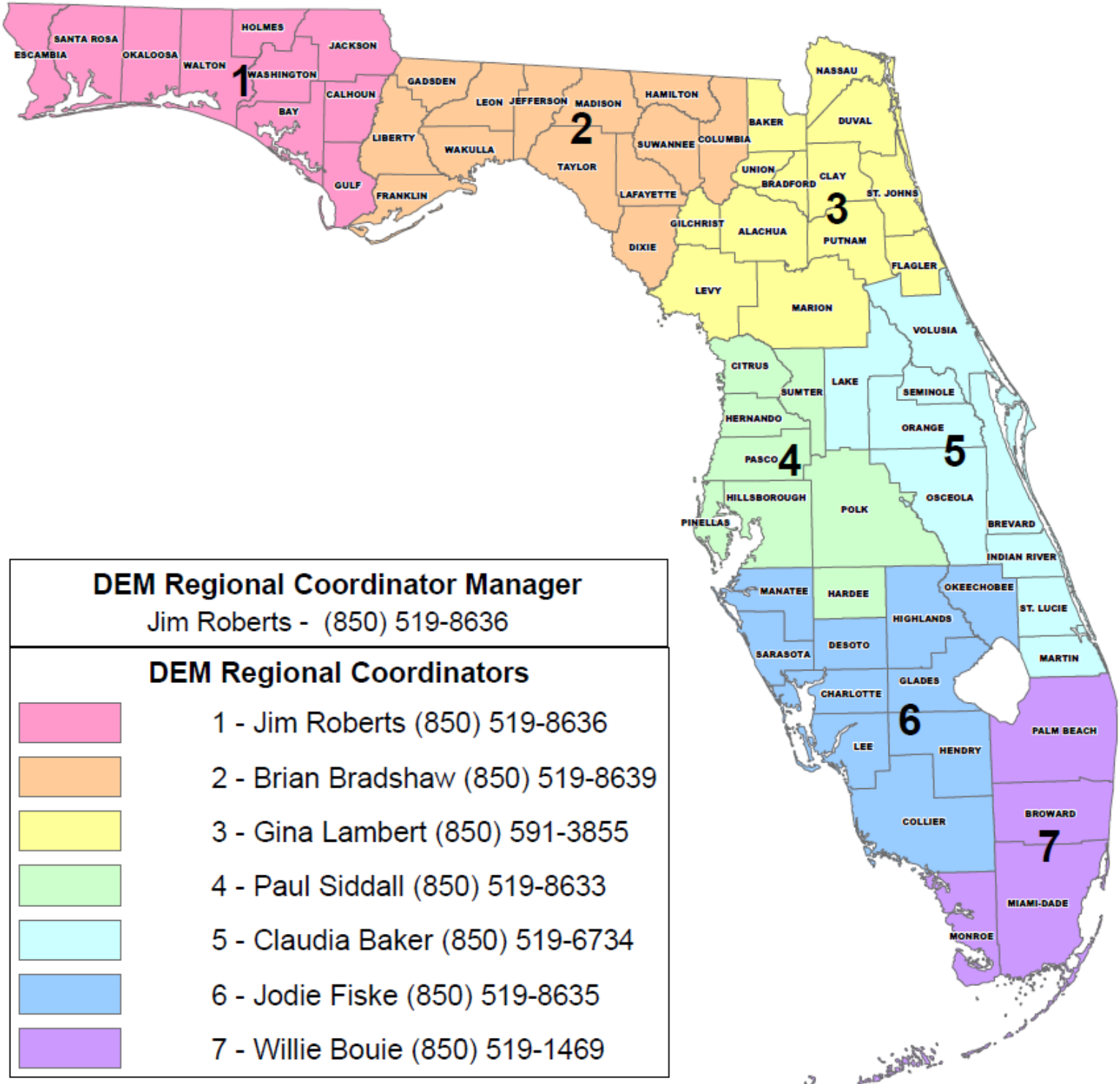

AGENDA ITEM #1-2
Call to Order & Introductions

Chairman Porter was not present so LEPC Coordinator, Katelyn Kubasik called the meeting to order at 9:33 a.m. The pledge of allegiance was said and roll call was conducted.

AGENDA ITEM #3
Presentation: Florida Gas Transmission Natural Gas Pipeline

Mr. Michael Laycock of Florida Gas Transmission Company gave a presentation on High Pressure Natural Gas Pipelines & Emergency Response. He discussed compressor stations, and other facilities that including meter stations, mainline valves, and lateral line block valves.

Mike showed a video of the Inglis Blowdown which demonstrated has being blown off in Central Florida when working on a 36-inch line gas needed to be vented off. Over 1,000 lbs. of pressure was released. He went on to discuss pipeline markers that alert you on the presence of a pipeline, these markers contain the name of the operator and emergency contact information. Mike stressed the importance of markers and stated that markers do not necessarily represent the exact location of the pipeline facilities within the easement.

Mr. Laycock went on the explain that if there is a pipeline rupture it can cause severe damage, effecting infrastructure, roads, hospitals, power plants and is very expensive. Not only that, but there is also a high possibility of severe injury and loss of life. If an incident happens, call 911 immediately.

Mr. Laycock provided a reference sheet for recommended evacuation distances that can be found attached to these minutes.

AGENDA ITEM #8 LEPC HazMat Exercise 2020-2021

Chief Marshall explained that since the last meeting there has been a side meeting with a few of the HazMat team leaders who are looking to create a tabletop exercise possibly in person, based on a two-year plan. The City of Cape Coral has applied for a PHMSA grant for natural gas emergencies. There will be a tabletop with local fire departments and the assistance of the LEPC will be requested which will help completed task 7 in the LEPC contract. Moving forward, an exercise will begin to be planned in the summer months to be held in 2022, there will be more information on this provided at the May LEPC meeting.

AGENDA ITEM #9 Southwest Florida LEPC Training Subcommittee Report

Chief Marshall explained that the SWF LEPC Training Subcommittee is currently conducting multiple classes. He brought to attention that at the last LEPC meeting there was discussion of a Bomb Tech HazMat Class and that was completed in January 2021 with the assistance of Manatee County, Estero Fire Rescue as well as the Lee County Bomb Squad. There will be a HazMat Tech Course in Charlotte County coming up, registration is full there will be 24 students. Charlotte County will also be scheduling another class that was approved last year. In the City of Cape Coral there will be a Safety Officer Class held virtually opened to 30 students. If there are any questions, please reach out to Chief Marshall. Chief Marshall added that there

will be a Propane Emergency Class in Cape Coral, it will be 6 days long. Half of the class will be paid for by the City of Cape Coral and the other half by the LEPC, taking us to the end of the budget for the year. The class will be held 3 days at Cape Coral and 3 days neighboring departments in the end of June.

Chief Marshall explained that for FY21-22 there have been two submittals for classes, a HazMat Tech class in Charlotte County and a HazMat Tech class in North Collier. Each class rounds about \$24,000 for 24 students equaling \$48,000. He suggested the LEPC sets aside \$20,000 like we have in the past for the HazMat Symposium if there is one in 2022.

Chief Marshall entertained a motion to approve the two HazMat Tech courses for 2022 and setting aside funds for the HazMat Symposium. A motion was made by Scott Davis to approve the training schedule for FY22 as presented. The motion was seconded by Mr. Brian Massey and passed unanimously.

AGENDA ITEM #10 Tier II Reporting and E-Plan Update

Chief Marshall reported that he and Ms. Kubasik conducted two virtual E-Plan, EPCRA and Shelter in Place presentations. He stated that 622 facilities have submitted their Tier II reports, last year there were 801 facilities so currently about 179 facilities still need to submit before the March 1, 2021 deadline.

Mr. Dave Rawicz from Cheney Brothers reminded everyone that if they have regulated risk management program chemicals, the deadline for reports and fees is April 1, 2021.

Table 1 - Evacuation Distance in Feet

The applicable leak or rupture condition is that of a sustained trench fire fueled by non-toxic natural gas escaping from two full bore pipe ends. Blast overpressure is not addressed. The distances shown in Table 1 are intended to provide protection from burn injury and correspond to a thermal heat flux exposure level of 450 Btu/hr ft². This is the accepted limit of heat exposure for unprotected outdoor areas where people congregate; as established by the US Department of Housing & Development Code 24CFR51, Subpart C, Siting of HUD Assisted Projects Near Hazardous Operations Handling Conventional Fuels or Chemicals of an Explosive or Flammable Nature. The formula used to calculate distance was taken from the Gas Research Institute Report GRI-00/0189, *A Model for Sizing High Consequence Areas Associated with Natural Gas Pipelines*, 2001, prepared by C-FER Technologies. That model does not take into account wind or other factors which may greatly influence specific conditions. Users are advised that the distances shown in Table 1 are considered to be "general information" only and are not intended to replace a site specific risk analysis. The Pipeline Association for Public Awareness makes no warranty with respect to the usefulness of this information and assumes no liability for any and all damages resulting from its use. Anyone using this information does so at their own risk.

Summary of Petroleum Cleanup Requirements

OER provides this summary along with a list of emergency response cleanup contractors to assist responsible parties (RP) in meeting the FDEP cleanup requirements in Florida Statute 376 and Chapter 62-780 F.A.C. **The hiring of a contractor by the RP is typically needed** to provide the necessary equipment, personnel and expertise to address the discharge and meet all the regulatory requirements. Failure to promptly meet the requirements may result in enforcement action and recovery of cleanup costs. Typically, the quicker the cleanup, the lesser the extent of cleanup & cost. Cleanups may *not* be delayed while waiting for insurance or fault determinations. The RP, not the insurance company, is responsible for the cleanup and compliance, regardless of insurance coverage. Depending on many factors (especially depth and areal extent of contamination), cleanup costs typically range from \$3000 to \$25,000.

Applicability

Applies to spills of 25 gallons or more of petroleum products onto a pervious surface. Includes gasoline, diesel fuel, kerosene, jet fuel, etc. [Chapter 62-780.210](#) exempts the reporting of spills <25 gallons, provided they are cleaned up, properly disposed, and no contamination remains; otherwise these too are reportable within one week of discovery.

Notification Requirements

- Discharges must be reported as soon as possible, but no later than 24 hours.
- Notify DEP via the State Watch Office (SWO) at **(800-320-0519)**.
- If the discharge (of any amount) threatens or enters waters of the State, notify the State Watch Office and the National Response Center at **(800-424-8802)**.
- File a Public Notice of Pollution at <https://floridadep.gov/pollutionnotice>.
- Within 7 days, submit the required **Discharge Report Form (DRF)** to OER.

Cleanup Requirements:

- F.S. 376.305: “Any person discharging a pollutant...shall immediately undertake to contain, remove and abate the discharge to the satisfaction of the department.” The RP can use its own OSHA-trained personnel and equipment or hire a qualified contractor. Cleanup must conform to [Chapter 62-780 F.A.C.](#)
- Recover free product immediately (e.g., use absorbents, pumps, vacuum trucks, skimmers, etc.).
- **Soil removal**: usually takes longer. A contractor can handle all the following items and cleanup reports.
 - ❑ Before digging, call **811** for underground utilities check (gas lines, phone lines, power lines, etc.).
 - ❑ Obtain DOT or County/City right-of-way permit, depending on location.
 - ❑ Excavated soil shall be containerized (i.e., drums, roll-off containers), or temporarily stockpiled atop plastic sheeting and covered. May store on-site for a limited time but may not be practical or allowed on road right-of-ways. Storage off-site requires a DEP permit; therefore, the soil may *not* be taken back to the RP's facility.
 - ❑ **Disposal**: typically, at a permitted soil thermal treatment facility (or, local landfill if accepted).
 - ❑ **Note**: the amount of soil to be removed depends on amount spilled, soil permeability, area, time since the discharge, etc. A 25-gallon spill may be 1 dump truck load, but a 100-gallon spill may need several trucks.
- **Soil testing**: required to confirm cleanup and adequate soil removal per [Ch. 62-780.500](#) or [Ch. 62-780.525](#)
 - ❑ **Field screening** may be used (i.e., via Organic Vapor Analyzer [OVA]) when cleanups are conducted within 30 days of the discharge date. Excavate until OVA readings are <10 ppm. Readings should include the sidewalls and bottom of excavation. Odor or visual cannot be used alone; an instrument must be used.
 - ❑ **Visual excavation** to a depth of 1 foot beyond visually stained soil in all directions is *only* permissible when the spilled material provides visual staining (i.e., Hydraulic Oil, Used Oil, etc.), and has not been mixed with more volatile materials requiring OVA screening (i.e. Diesel, Gasoline, etc.).
 - ❑ **Lab samples** are required for cleanups extending past 30 days from the discharge date. Typically, at least 1 bottom and 4 sidewall samples are needed. Follow DEP Quality Assurance rules; contractor/lab personnel may need to be hired for sample collection. Contaminated soil must also be tested prior to disposal.

Source Removal Report

- A written, detailed SRR must be submitted to DEP **within 60 days** of cleanup.
- Requires many items, such as: cleanup description, disposal documentation (manifests), photographs, scaled site diagram, OVA readings, analytical lab reports, etc. DEP will thereafter notify the RP if the cleanup was adequate, or if further work is needed.

Per Lina Cerquera via email: "OER spoke to the reporting party (N. Noone) regarding the 2,500 gallon 12% Sodium Hypochlorite release at a Wastewater Facility (FLA014167) at the reported location.

OER informed the reporting party the release is above CERCLA's RQ and needs to be called into the National Response Center (800-424-8802).

The release occurred when a 1,000 gallon day tank was overflowed via the on-site 1,800 gallon bulk tanks. The Day Tank's secondary containment only holds about 500 gallons so it too, was overflowed.

It is estimated that approximately 2,000 gallons impacted nearby impervious and pervious surfaces in two areas approximately 10ft. x 10ft. & 20ft.x 2ft. in the middle of the property.

No storm drains or waterways were reported to have been impacted and the release was reported to be secured & contained on-site.

The release was reported to have occurred at 0500hrs. and since then, water has been applied to the material in an attempt to neutralize it.
