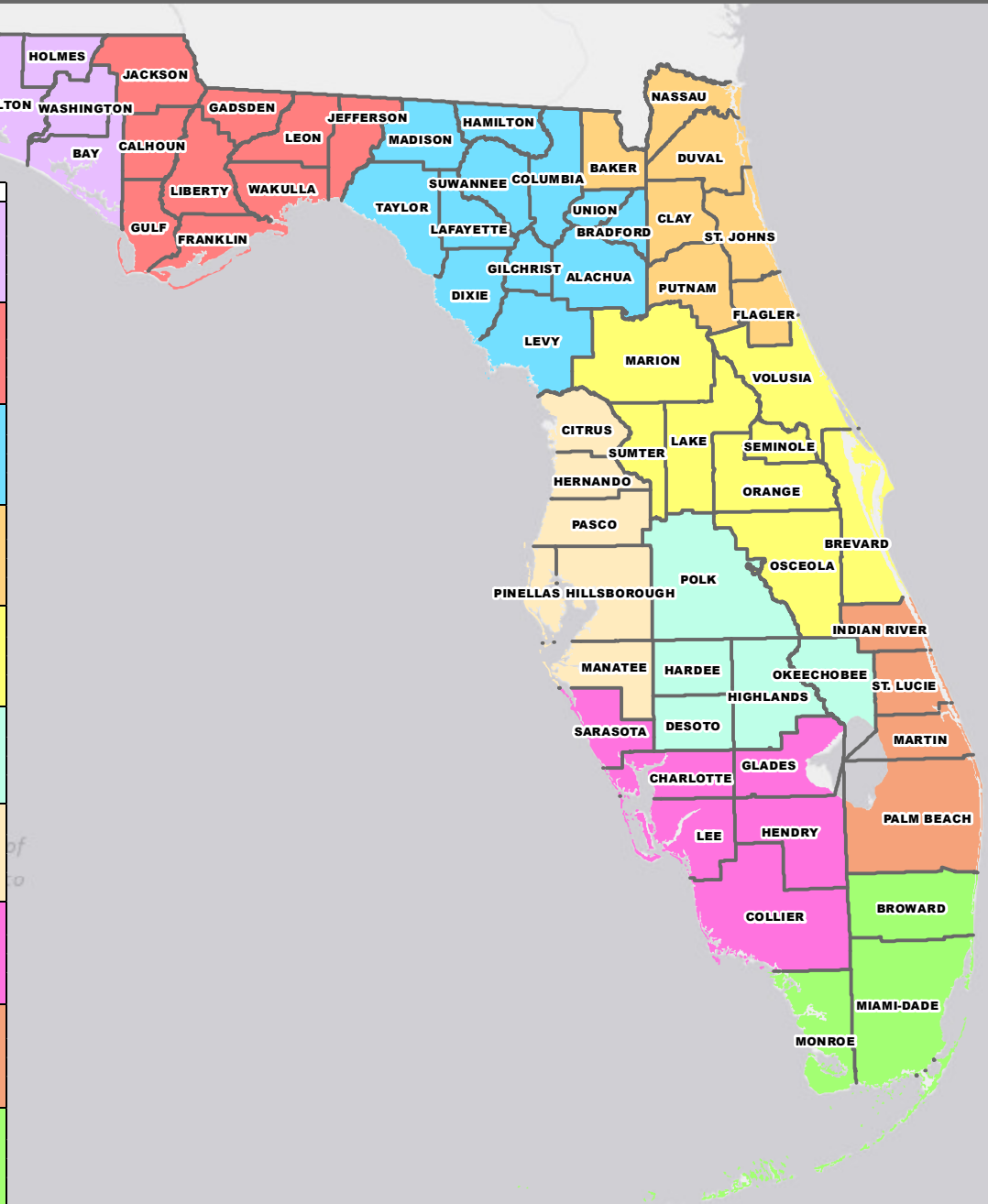

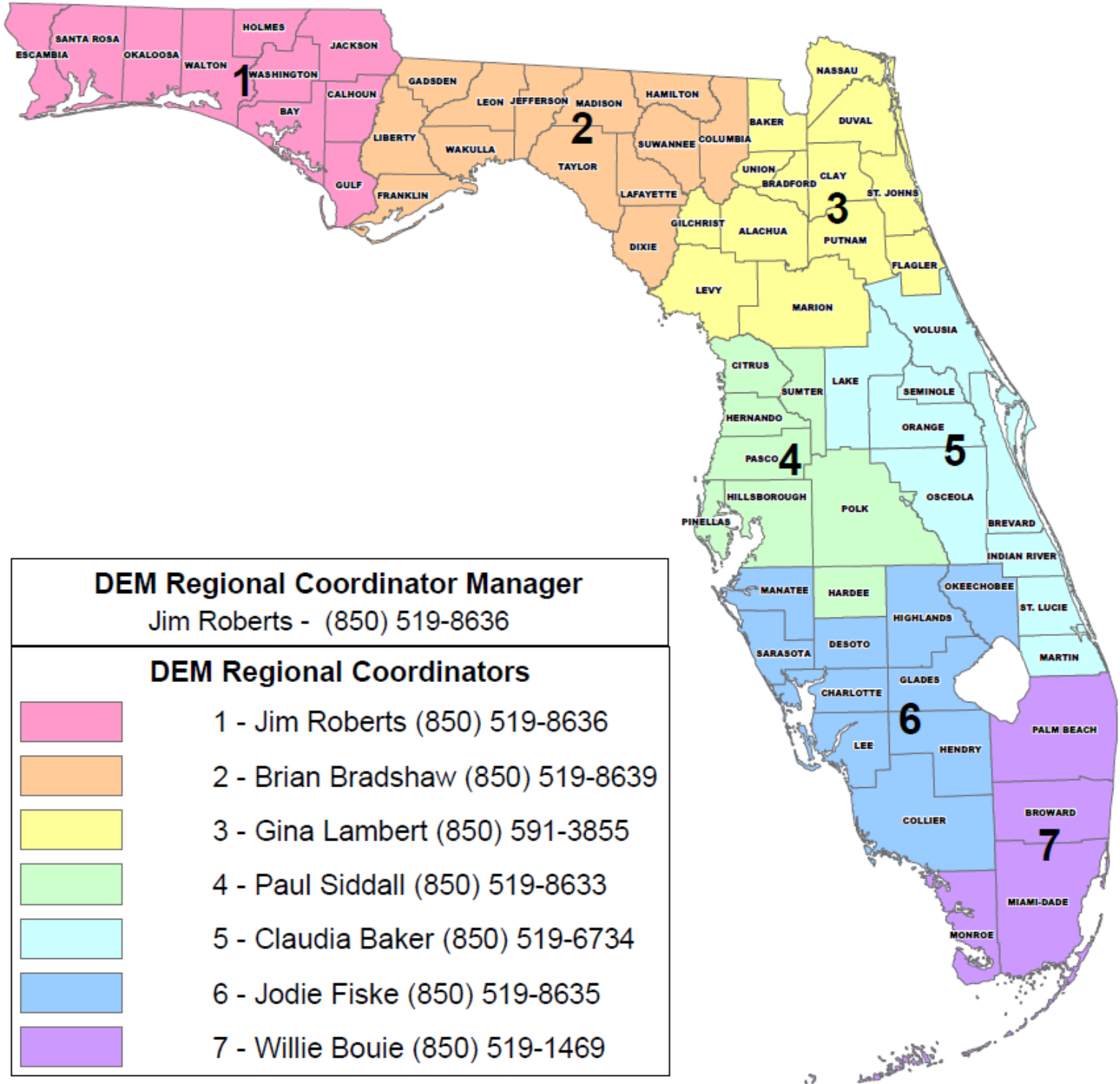

**AGENDA ITEM #1-3
Call to Order & Introductions**

There was no member who wished to give an invocation. Chief Marshall called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. Each member was asked to introduce themselves. The Pledge of Allegiance was said.

**AGENDA ITEM #4
Minutes of the February 24, 2022 Meeting**

Chief Marshall entertained a motion to accept the draft LEPC meeting minutes of the February 24, 2022 meeting.

A motion was made by Chief Scott Davis to approve the minutes of the February 24, 2022 LEPC meeting as presented. The motion was seconded by Chief Dan Sieber and passed unanimously.

AGENDA ITEM #5 LEPC Membership

There was one nomination form submitted for LEPC membership.

- Laura Phillips, Facility Owners and Operators (The Liquid Plant)

A motion was made by Chief Sieber to approve the LEPC membership of Laura Phillips. The motion was seconded by Chief Davis and passed unanimously.

Recertification of Members

Ms. Williams requested a motion authorizing the Chair to request recertification of all current LEPC members for additional two-year terms, sharing that the Florida State Emergency Response Commission Policies for Local Emergency Planning Committees states, in Section 1.E.3, "All members may be re-nominated and re-appointed through the SERC's biennial appointment process."

A motion was made by Chief Davis to authorize the Chair to request recertification by SERC of all present LEPC members for an additional two-years and seconded by Lieutenant Kenrick Roguska. The motion was approved unanimously.

AGENDA ITEM #6 2022 Hazardous Material Emergency Response Plan

Ms. Williams explained that our yearly update to the plan is complete, the final version is linked in the packet and can also be found on the SWFRPC website.

A motion was made by Chief Sieber to approve the LEPC Hazardous Material Emergency Response Plan update as presented. The motion was seconded by Chief Davis and passed unanimously.

AGENDA ITEM #7 Presentation

Chief Marshall gave the membership a brief overview of the BUXUS system. BUXUS is an online app designed for gas transmission systems to upload their pipelines so that first responders can log in and see where the pipelines are located to access during emergencies. The state has asked companies to join, with some joining and others not. The system would be great for

places that drill and utilize directional drilling, as it will allow first responders to know where the pipes are, where they lead, and where the leak is located. The app includes major transmission lines, but not small feeder lines.

AGENDA ITEM #9

SERC Meeting Recap

Ms. Williams attended the April SERC meeting that was held April 14-15, 2022 in Altamonte Springs, FL. A quorum was not present at the SERC meeting. The following items were discussed:

Offshore Hazmat Pilot Program: The status of the U.S. Coast Guard, NOVA Southeastern, and FDEM/SERC Offshore Hazmat Response training initiative was discussed. The first training was scheduled for late April in Fort Lauderdale. This first pilot training delivery will be evaluated by subject matter experts to help the TTF identify potential improvements and finalize the length of the training.

HazMat Working Group: They finalized their “How-To Guide” that will be included in the contracts and posted on FDEM SharePoint.

LEPC Support Contract: The shortage of funding for the LEPC contracts will remain in place through the 2022 and 2023 contract cycles. FDEM’s proposal to fund the program and state and regional LEPCs was approved for half of the requested budget. LEPCs contract statewide will remain the same for the next year.

Chief Marshall announced that the next SERC meeting will take place on July 14-15 at the Naples Grande Hotel in Naples, FL.

AGENDA ITEM #10

LEPC HazMat Exercise 2021-2022

Chief Styza gave an overview of the Full-Scale Exercise that took place March 8-10 in Charlotte County, with various HazMat teams responding in accordance with the State Emergency Response Plan. The HazMat teams setup operations in a hurricane affected area with simulated potential hazmat leaks and spills at various locations, including Cheyney Brothers, AmeriGas, and the Water Treatment Facility. Three HazMat teams met at a base operation each day, simulated calls for reported spills, left as a rapid assessment team, verified if there was a leak or issue, and reported back to request resources. The major hazards were liquid petroleum gas, anhydrous ammonia, and chlorine. It was very successful exercise.

Chief Davis commented that each team stayed busy and worked well together. Chief Marshall stated that this was the first exercise of the HazMat portion of the newly approved State Emergency Response Plan. The 48th CST evaluated the exercise and provided helpful feedback.

Chief Styza commented the success of bringing together HazMat teams from different areas and how well they were able to work alongside one another.

The After-Action Report will be finalized in June.

AGENDA ITEM #11

Southwest Florida LEPC Training Subcommittee Report

Chief Styza stated that the Charlotte County HazMat Tech course was completed at the end of March and was successful. Chief Marshall commented that there is currently a HazMat tech course happening out of North Collier with 28 students from Collier and Lee Counties.

Chief Marshall asked for suggestions for trainings that would be completed by August 1 to be included in a proposal for FDEM. Chief Styza suggested a one-day Detection and Rapid Analysis of HazMats class repeated three days. Captain Wilkins suggested a one-day Detection and Rapid Analysis of Hazardous Material Technician Course that will run for three days. Chief Marshall suggested a HazMat Tech Course that would finish at the end of July in Fort Myers.

A motion to include the suggested courses on the training funds proposal for FDEM to be submitted on Friday, May 27th, was made by Chief Davis and seconded by Lieutenant Roguska. The motion was approved unanimously.

Mr. Yanc announced free trainings offered by OSHA, with classes including Operations-level Response to HazMat, HazMat Tanker Roll-over Response, and an Anhydrous Ammonia and Chlorine Leak trainings, available to 40 students.

Chief Marshall discussed funding for the next fiscal year, as of October 1. The HazMat Symposium typically utilizes between \$20,000-25,000. Chief Marshall requested a motion for allocating more funding to provide the opportunity to send more people from the local jurisdictions.

A motion to increase the funding allocated for the HazMat Symposium to \$24,000 was

made by Chief Sieber and seconded by Chief Davis. The motion was approved unanimously.

Chief Marshall asked for quotes for classes for next FY, starting October 1, submitted to Ms. Williams for the Training Subcommittee to rank before the August 25th meeting.

Chief Marshall stated there have been USAR deployments. There was discussion of a recent incident in Sarasota County at the Water Treatment Plant. There was discussion of a tanker rollover in Charlotte County earlier this year, and about contracted clean-up companies and whether they always have the equipment or personnel for successful clean-up.

Local Emergency Planning Committees (LEPCs) must have representatives from the following occupational categories, as required in Section 301(c) of the Emergency Planning and Community Right-To-Know Act (EPCRA):

1. elected state/local officials;
2. law enforcement;
3. emergency management (civil defense in EPCRA);
4. firefighting;
5. first aid;
6. health;
7. local environmental;
8. hospital;
9. transportation personnel;
10. broadcast/print media;
11. community groups;
12. facility owners/operators subject to EPCRA;
13. interested citizens;
14. non-elected local officials;
15. water management district representative;
16. local option.

There should be a continued good faith effort on behalf of the LEPC chairperson to ensure that all of the occupational categories are represented on the LEPC.

Note: The following SERC categories are not EPCRA LEPC Membership Categories (§ 301(c)):

- *First Aid*
- *Interested Citizen*
- *Non-elected Official*
- *Water Management District*
- *Local Option*
- *Local Environmental*

Pursuant to 42 USC §11001(c), Establishment of local emergency planning committees, each local emergency planning committee “shall include, at a minimum, representatives from each of the following groups or organizations: elected State and local officials; law enforcement, civil defense, firefighting, first aid, health, local environmental, hospital, and transportation personnel; broadcast and print media; community groups; and owners and operators of facilities subject to the requirements of this subchapter.”

THOMAS YATABE - STATE EMERGENCY RESPONSE COMMISSION AWARDS PROGRAM PROCEDURES

The State Emergency Response Commission (SERC) has established the following procedures to guide the recommendations and review of nominations for the State of Florida Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA) Awards Program.

1. **Four categories of eligibility** are established for the awards program:
 - a. Recognition of an outstanding achievement, accomplishment or superior participation in the hazardous materials planning program by a **member of the SERC**.
 - b. Recognition of an outstanding achievement, accomplishment or superior participation in the hazardous materials planning program by a **member or alternate of a Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC)**.
 - c. Recognition of an outstanding achievement, accomplishment or superior participation in the hazardous materials planning program by an **individual, agency, or organization**.
 - d. Recognition of an outstanding achievement, accomplishment or superior participation in the hazardous materials planning program by an **industry or business**.

These categories may be expanded to address unique circumstances at the discretion of the SERC.

2. Each LEPC Chairperson shall submit the name of a single nominee, chosen from one the four categories of eligibility, who has made an outstanding contribution to the hazardous materials planning program **as the LEPC's nomination for a Thomas Yatabe - SERC Award**. Multiple nominees may be recommended for Certificates of Appreciation for their contributions to the program.
3. The single Thomas Yatabe - SERC Award and/or Certificates of Appreciations nomination(s) from each District shall be reviewed by the SERC's Membership Committee. The committee shall forward its recommendations to the SERC.
4. Recommendations for awards will be acted upon by the SERC on an annual basis at its fall (October) meeting. Awards will be given at the SERC January meeting.
5. Nominations for awards in each category may be offered by members of any category. All nominations must be received by the SERC by September to be considered for that year's awards. Nominations for recognition for outstanding contributions and certificates of appreciation, must be made in writing by the respective LEPC Chairperson, must be directed to the Chairman of the SERC, and must be accompanied by an Awards Nomination Form.
6. The SERC may elect to suspend or amend the time limitations of these procedures for good cause.
